JUDICIAL MEETING MINUTES

- I. **CALL TO ORDER** – Charlie Weis, Judicial Chairman; called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
 - II. **ROLL CALL** – Chairman, Charlie Weis; Village President, Jeff Roberts; and Members, Sarah Casady, Tim Maloney, and Darrell Sears. Also Present: Police Chief, Mike Spafford; Municipal Clerk of Courts, Tessa Anderson
 - III. **MUNICIPAL COURT REVIEW** – The committee reviewed the Municipal Court Financials. There is currently \$61,000 outstanding, \$38,000 are filed with Collections and \$14,000 Juvenile.
 - IV. **SPRING CLEAN UP** – The Village Newsletter, that will be included in the Utility bills, will have the spring clean-up notice to residents. The deadline for the properties to be cleaned up will be May 15. If residents do not have their properties cleaned up by the deadline, they will be issued a citation.
 - V. **EMERGENCY DISASTER DRILL** – A school bus/drunk driver mock accident exercise will be done in May. The following departments will be required to attend: The Village Board, fire, police and ambulance. Decision will have to be made on who is in charge. This will be put on the Village Regular Board meeting agenda in April.
 - VI. **UTILITY RIGHT OF WAY** – The Village Board members are reviewing statues and rules governing this type of utility pole. Clerk/Treasurer, Reineccius will set up a committee meeting with Mobilitie to discuss in more detail.
 - VII. **WORK IMPROVEMENT PLAN** – The committee reviewed the March 22nd Police training with Chief Spafford.

Chief, Spafford stated that he has had meth. discussions with the sheriff and other police departments. The Burnett County Sheriff’s department and individual villages will be targeting known drug users with extra attention.

Incoming calls to the Village’s police department are all logged into a spreadsheet.

Chief Spafford is researching an App and hotline for residents to report crimes.

The committee reviewed a complaint by Jeff and Jackie Hulleman. The Hulleman’s are concerned about speeding cars on their street. The committee recommends adding signs on the street, “Slow down...children in area.” And, add more time sitting patrols on this street.
 - VIII. **MOTION TO ADJOURN** – Motion to adjourn the Judicial Committee Meeting at 7:10 p.m. was made by Member, Sears; seconded by Village President, Roberts. **Motion carried 3-0.**
